BE PERSISTENT

The Gospel story of the **persistent woman** who is determined to get her way, reminds me of the **Energizer Bunny**, she just keeps coming and coming with her demands. This parable is about **praying always and about never giving up**. It is important to recognize that those are two interrelated ideas: **to be constantly mindful of our relationship with God and to persist in faith**. As the song goes, **“You can’t have one without the other”**.

The Gospel story concludes with an alarming question uttered by Jesus namely:

“ When the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?”

That’s the question addressed to each of us. Do we really believe God’s kingdom is germinating among us now? How far are we willing to go to cultivate it? Are we faith-filled enough to pray for those who mistreat us and for those who promote injustice?

As we look around at societies situation, at **injustice and violence that plague our country and world, there is no earthly reason to believe that it can all change**. That’s precisely why the persistent widow is held up to us as an example. Weariness is no excuse. **Prayer has been found to be effective**. Prayer will awaken our memory of Jesus and remind us that the kingdom doesn’t operate on the rules of this world. Only prayer will open us to the grace to overcome the inevitable disillusionments we meet in life. **Only prayer can open us to the inspirations that will keep us going, and going and going until justice reigns**.
