THE MAIN THING

Capitalism ... that Serves the Common Good

Carissimi,

Consider what Bishop Robert McElroy said recently about the instrumental role a principled and compassionate capitalism can play in upholding and advancing the common good:

"...the tradition of Catholic social teaching is unequivocally on the side of strong governmental and societal protections for the powerless, the worker, the homeless, the hungry, those without decent medical care, the unemployed.

"This stance of the Church's teaching flows from the teaching of the Book of Genesis: The creation is the gift of God to all of humanity. Thus, in the most fundamental way, there is a universal destination for all of the material goods that exist in this world. Wealth is a common heritage, not at its core a right of lineage or acquisition.

"For this reason, free markets do not constitute a first principle of economic justice. Their moral worth is instrumental in nature and must be structured by government to accomplish the common good.

"In Catholic teaching, the very rights which are being denied in our society to large numbers of those who live in our nation are intrinsic human rights: The right to medical care; to decent housing; to the protection of human life from conception to natural death; of the right to food; of the right to work.

"Catholic teaching sees these rights not merely as points for negotiation, provided only if there is excess in society after the workings of the free market system accomplished their distribution of the nation's wealth.

"Rather, these rights are basic claims which every man, woman and family has upon our nation as a whole."

Offering of Letters Update

Dear St. Ignatius Parishioners,

We did it!

In 2017, churches and individuals across the United States sent more than 176,000 letters, 164,000 emails, and made 32,000 calls to Congress urging lawmakers to do their part and pass a budget that puts us on track to ending hunger.

As a result of your advocacy, Congress passed a fiscal year 2018 budget that largely maintained funding levels for both domestic and international anti-hunger programs. In fact, the budget included increases for some key programs, such as summer EBT and international food aid!

This year, we again are faced with a budget proposal from the president that would make deep budget cuts — \$1.5 trillion to programs that help people struggling with hunger and poverty. Last year's tax cuts reduced revenue, making anti-hunger programs even more vulnerable this year.

On this weekend of June 9-10, 2018, we need to flood Capitol Hill with letters again and let Congress know that these cuts are unacceptable. St. Ignatius Church is conducting a Bread for the World Letter-Writing session after each Mass on Sunday in the pews and in Ignatian Hall focused on protecting federally funded policies and safety-net programs to end hunger and poverty in Baltimore and in the United States by writing letters to our U.S. Congress members, urging them to continue funding these vital initiatives. We will provide fact sheets on hunger and poverty, pens, writing paper; envelopes, stamps, and the addresses of respective legislators to contact. Please make a difference and join us! You can also call (800-826-3688) [or email your members of Congress](#) and urge them to invest in and protect key programs that will help reduce hunger and poverty. Visit the parish website to use the email link and for more information on the project.

Last year's letters made a difference. Let's make an even bigger difference this year!

In the state of Maryland, 1 in 8 people are food insecure; 1 in 4 of Baltimore City's school aged children are hungry when they arrive to school; and 25% of Baltimore City's residents live in food deserts where no healthy, affordable food options can be found.

As Congress works on the fiscal year 2019 budget and spending bills, I ask you to invest in and protect key programs that will reduce hunger and poverty. Our country and the world have made progress against hunger and poverty in recent decades. I want you to continue to invest in programs like SNAP and tax credits for low-income workers. Continued funding for programs that reduce hunger and poverty around the world are also important to me.

At my parish, St. Ignatius Church in Baltimore City, our Loaves and Fishes Ministry is helping the homeless. Every Saturday and Sunday night, we serve sandwiches, soup, fresh fruit, coffee, and a sweet snack. We also collect bags of groceries regularly for the pantry at the Catholic Worker Viva House to support low-income families.

My faith calls me to urge you to make public investments that will move us toward the end of hunger.
